Field Trips Abound!!

This fall, we have two field trips to invite you to.

The first trip takes us back **Prairieland Peruvian Alpaca** farm in Worden, Illinois. Owned by Lita and John Murphy, this farm houses 24 very gentle and sociable huacaya alpacas. Lita excitedly informed us that two of these alpacas are 2-month old babies, otherwise known as crias. You can visit their website, www.prairielandalpacas.com for more information.

This trip is scheduled for **Saturday, Oct. 25th, 11am-5pm**. Space must be limited so please come by the shop to secure a reservation soon!

Our second field trip is an adventure to **Yarn Farm** in St. Claire, Missouri where we have the chance to visit merino sheep, goats, alpaca, and llamas. **Yarn Farm** belongs to Linda Beckley, president of the St. Louis Weaver's Guild, and her husband. In addition to meeting the animals, we will also learn about how Linda grows and processes her flax which is then turned into linen.

This trip is scheduled for **Saturday, Nov. 8th, 11am-5pm**.

We request a visiting fee of **\$10 per person** which goes to these wonderful farmers for their time and generosity. Visitors will also be invited to purchase roving and yarn during their visit.

The creative force behind this Wentzville company is Bjorn and his partner, Rex. In our shop is HKY's **Merino Mohair** in a worsted weight. The colorways are incredible, and the yarn is amazingly soft. Come take a look!

Cherry Tree Hill

Cheryl of **Cherry Tree Hill** gave us a call the other day to talk about her new line of sock yarn: **Supersock Select**.

This sock yarn, dyed in a variety of wonderful colors, has a lower micron count which results in a softer, higher quality yarn. There is definitely a difference.

Also in the east window is **Montague**, a linen lace table runner. This wonderful playful pattern makes creative use of increases and decreases. This table runner was knitted out of Berroco **NaturLin**.



In our west window is the **Adult Surprise Jacket** and was knitted by Thi.

This classic piece is an Elizabeth Zimmermann design and was knitted out Cascade **Eco Wool**.

What I wanted to achieve with the ASJ is a clean, contemporary version of the jacket. I also had the option of knitting the ASJ as a cardigan which offered a more fitted garment. Minimal striping was also added for interest.
